

Cambodia Project Environmental Impact Statement:

The purpose of the environmental impact statement is to show the process your group went through when determining the best option. People of the community and leaders are very interested to see why the option you choose is best for their village and for the environment. You may use the below chart as a model, but do not feel limited by the structure. You may look online for other structures or work with your group and teacher to find a way of presenting your project in a way that is best for you.

<p>STEP ONE: Statement of Need/Purpose Describe problem and define <i>characteristics</i> of an acceptable solution.</p>	
<p>STEP TWO: Define and explain all possible options.</p>	
<p>STEP THREE: Of those options, identify reasonable alternatives. These alternatives are feasible from a technical and economic perspective, and satisfy the need/purpose.</p>	
<p>STEP FOUR: Evaluate your reasonable alternatives by considering the following: <i>land use, population and economic environment, hazardous waste, educational and academic programs, cultural resources, farmland, air quality, noise, visual environment, water quality, floodplanes, natural resources, animal life, ect.</i></p>	
<p>STEP FIVE: How will your project affect the community and world in the future? How will you follow up?</p>
